



DOT joined us in May 2005 and she is a 13 year old dappled grey mare. Dot came from the same farm as Buddy, her mother Grandma Rosie, and her son Ramsay. When Dot had arrived we were worried that she too had lice but she did not, though she did have worms and it was evident she had foundered so we quickly made some changes in her diet and she did very well.

Dot and Michelle spent a lot of time of time alone from the others, as Dot was very quiet and removed from the herd at first. Dot is an observant and sensitive little horse. Dot was very clear with us that she did not like going on visits and that lots of children and large groups made her anxious, and so Dot has remained here at the farm.

Dot had been adopted out in 2006 as a buddy for a big horse named Tony who sadly died. Dot came back to the farm and we continue to look for a forever home for her. Dot has shown signs of long term damage to her lungs likely from poor quality or moldy hay over long periods of time. Dot has done well here but our vets at West Wind Veterinary Hospital advise us that Dot will need special consideration in choosing feed that will not cause her to become heavy and cough. Dot does well on grass in the summer and cubes, and complete feed in the winter.
